FORGIVENESS OF WRONGS against us is something that many of us Christians find extremely difficult. We probably think Peter is extremely generous in suggesting that he should forgive his brother as many as seven times. Jesus pushes it even further by saying, "Not seven, I tell you, but seventy-seven times." In practice, this means an infinite number of times. It seems idealistic and impractical. Further reflection may help us realise there is really no alternative for the Christian and the truly human person than to forgive - indefinitely. ... Strange as it may seem, the all-powerful God can't fully forgive the person to whom pardon is offered but refuses it. Because ultimately, the problem is not just one of 'forgiveness' but also of 'reconciliation'. And where there is no reconciliation there cannot be forgiveness in the full sense. God can't just say a million times over to the sinner, "I forgive you." Forgiveness on our part is not just to say, "I know you did something terrible but because I'm a Christian, I forgive you." You may feel very good talking in that way but it has not really solved the problem or healed the wound. My responsibility is not over by saying, "I forgive", if the other person has not changed their attitude towards me in any way. But even with the best will in the world I cannot force another person to be reconciled with me. Ultimately, reconciliation is a personal decision on each side.
