TODAY IS KNOWN AS GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY In today's (gospel) Jesus emphasises the self-sacrificing

The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.

First, he contrasts the good shepherd who owns the sheep to someone who is simply hired to look after them. The hired man thinks primarily of his own welfare and, Jesus, on the other hand, will not be like a hired person because:

... I lay down my life for the sheep.

He knows his sheep

Second, Jesus says:

I am the good shepherd. I know my own...

There is a mutual bond of love and intimacy. That love is compared to the deep mutual relationship that exists between Jesus and his Father.

One shepherd and one flock

Third, the good shepherd deeply desires that many other sheep should come to identify themselves with him:

I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd.

There are still so many millions of people who have not yet heard the message of a loving God ... They seek meaning and happiness in their lives by pursuing all kinds of other goals which inevitably turn to ashes: material abundance, status in the eyes of others, power over others, mistaking pleasure and hedonism for happiness ...

No matter how closely we follow in the footsteps of our Shepherd, in fact, the more closely we follow him, the more likely it is that we will be rejected and even attacked. More tragic still, however, there are so many people who claim Christ as Lord, many of them very good and sincere people, who are often divided, even bitterly divided among themselves. Here, more than anywhere is there a need for all to follow one Shepherd and form one flock. Otherwise how can we give witness to the love of Christ if that love is lacking among the servants of Jesus? READ THE COMMENTARY IN

AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR TRAINING, SUN 14 JUL 10.30AM. In 2020 St Anthony's Parish was gifted a defibrillator AED device, a potential life saving device for Cardiac arrest, by the Michael Hughes Foundation. This device is located at the back of the Church. The training of using the AED device was held by Julie Hughes in August 2020. The Parish is holding another refresher course led by Julie Hughes on Sun 14 July at 10.30am in church after the 9am Mass. Training generally runs for 1-1.5 hours, depending on the number of participants and questions raised. The training covers what is cardiac arrest, basic first aid principles, CPR, use and maintenance of the defibrillator and risk assessments for our church. encourage parishioners who are regulars at other mass time slots to attend this training to gain basic knowledge of how to use an AED in an emergency. A victim's chance of survival decreases by 10% every minute after a sudden cardiac arrest. The course is free to parishioners. treasure we ourselves have found.


