## **Excerpt from a commentary on the Sunday Readings**

We are approaching the end of the Church year. In the Gospels of these Sundays, we are looking at the final phase of Jesus' life before his suffering, death and resurrection. Last week we saw Jesus leaving Jericho on the last stage of his journey to Jerusalem. He healed the blind beggar, Bartimaeus, who, once he regained his sight, saw that the only thing he could do was to go with Jesus on that final journey. Today's story takes place in Jerusalem itself. The context of the story is important. "Sacrifice" is mentioned in both the Second Reading and the Gospel. There are clear links with the Temple, the Old Testament and Jewish Law. A Scribe approaches Jesus. He is an expert in interpreting the Law. There were more than 600 laws, too many for an ordinary person to grasp. He asks a question which was much-debated among scholars of the day: Of all these many laws, which was the most central, the most basic—the one that summed up all the others?
